our focus has transitioned from war rescue operations in Yemen, Palestine, Rohingya, Afghanistan and Somalia to providing refugees in Bosnia, Belarus, Duinkerke with emergency aid and relief work.

Today our day-to-day operations in Afrika and Azia where we are helping al lot of communities by making waterwells and by sponsoring the construction of vital building like schools, orphanage's, hospital's and mosques.

WHAT WE DO

Water & Sanitation Projects

We implemented sustainable water solutions through the construction of water wells, hand pumps, and village drinking points. These projects improved access to safe drinking water, reduced waterborne diseases, and eased daily hardship for vulnerable communities.

Food Security & Nutrition Support

We supported vulnerable families through food parcels, hot meals, and Ramadan iftar distributions. These interventions helped reduce hunger and ensured families could meet their basic nutritional needs during critical periods.

Emergency & Humanitarian Relief

We responded rapidly to emergencies caused by floods, conflict, displacement, and economic shocks. Our assistance included food, water, medical aid, and essential supplies for families facing immediate life-threatening conditions.

Medical & Health Assistance

We supported urgent medical cases by covering treatment costs and essential healthcare services. This assistance helped vulnerable individuals access life-saving care they would otherwise be unable to afford.

Qurbani (Eid al-Adha) Projects

Through Qurbani distributions, we provided meat to low-income households across multiple countries. This project ensured nutritious food access while allowing donors to fulfill their religious obligations with dignity.



Livelihood & Economic Development

We implemented livelihood initiatives aimed at improving household income and self-reliance. These projects supported sustainable economic activities that help families move beyond short-term aid.

Education & Social Support

We provided educational and social assistance, including school and college fee support and aid to vulnerable families. These interventions strengthened long-term resilience and protected children and youth from dropping out of education.

Community Infrastructure & Religious Facilities

We supported the construction and maintenance of community and religious facilities, including mosques and cultural centers. These spaces serve as safe, dignified hubs for worship, learning, and community gatherings.



WHERE WE WORK IN ASIA



Pakistan

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere supported vulnerable families in Pakistan with a total investment of €14,475, delivered through trusted local partners. Our work focused on what communities needed most: safe drinking water, rapid flood relief, Qurbani food support, and strong on-the-ground follow-up to make sure every euro reached its purpose.

Alongside emergency assistance for flood-affected households, we also funded practical water solutions including a hydro-geological assessment and a community hand pump so families can access clean water more reliably. Throughout the year, we strengthened monitoring and implementation support to ensure transparent delivery and consistent quality across all activities.



Nepal

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere focused its work in Nepal on one life-changing priority: safe drinking water. With a total investment of €22,320.04, we funded the construction and renovation of water wells and village drinking points in rural areas where families previously depended on distant, unsafe sources.


These projects were designed to be sustainable—covering drilling, pump installations, protective measures to reduce contamination, and reliable access points for daily use. Alongside the infrastructure, we also supported communities during implementation through locally necessary logistics and basic assistance tied directly to the well sites. The result is long-term impact: safer water, better hygiene, and fewer waterborne illnesses—while also reducing the daily burden on women and children who used to spend hours fetching water.



Indonesia

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere continued its work in Indonesia together with a trusted local partner in Java, combining short-term community support with long-term development. With a total allocation of €8,258.08, we responded to urgent local needs (including storm-related support and Ramadan initiatives) while also investing in sustainable projects that strengthen community life—most notably economic development through a Palm Oil Project and religious/community infrastructure in Jepara (a cultural centre/mosque delivered in phases).

Every expense was documented through official bank transactions, signed receipts, and project invoices, reflecting our commitment to transparency and responsible delivery on the ground.



INDIA

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere focused its work in India on a clear, high-impact priority: safe drinking water. With a total investment of €8,700, we supported the construction of 23 water wells, helping hundreds of families gain sustainable access to clean water—reducing waterborne illnesses and easing the daily burden of water collection, especially for women and children.

To support vulnerable households in the same project areas, we also distributed food parcels as complementary aid. All funding was implemented through local partnerships and tracked through documented receipts and partner overviews, reflecting our commitment to transparent delivery and measurable results.



PHILIPPINES

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere supported the Muslim community in the Philippines during Ramadan through a simple but meaningful action: helping people break their fast together with dignity. With a total allocation of €309.68 (transferred on 12/03/2024), we financed iftar meals at the mosque, reaching worshippers and families in need through a trusted local partner.

Beyond providing food, this initiative strengthened community solidarity during a spiritually important period—showing how even modest, well-targeted support can bring real comfort and connection. The full amount is documented in our official accounts and matches the bank transfer made for this specific project.



SRI LANKA

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere delivered a broad, needs-driven programme in Sri Lanka, with a total expenditure of €13,636.16. Our biggest focus was safe water, funding multiple well projects to reduce illness and ease daily hardship for families who lack reliable drinking water.

Alongside this, we strengthened food security through Ramadan support and Qurbani distributions, responded to flood emergencies, and provided targeted help where it matters most—covering medical costs, supporting college fees, and investing in media and documentation so our work remains verifiable and transparent. Together, these interventions combined long-term solutions with urgent relief for vulnerable communities across the country.



WHERE WE WORK IN MIDDLE EAST



YEMEN

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere delivered life-saving assistance in Yemen (Hadramout) through our local partner, Sana'e Al Ma'rouf Humanitarian Foundation, with a total deployment of €48,628.65. In a context of prolonged crisis and deep food insecurity, our priority was clear: getting food to families who simply cannot cope alone.

The largest share of funding went to Ramadan support—covering iftar meals and food packs—followed by Qurbani distributions during Eid al-Adha. We also kept a smaller emergency line for families in acute need, and funded implementation support to coordinate, monitor, and deliver aid efficiently on the ground. Finally, we honoured our commitments by settling an outstanding balance related to a 2023 Ramadan project, ensuring responsible and transparent partner relations.



LEBANON

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere responded to Lebanon's deepening socio-economic crisis with a practical mix of scheduled Ramadan support and rapid emergency relief, working entirely through our trusted local partner.

With a total deployment of €7,520, we helped families meet immediate survival needs through food assistance, hot iftar meals, and support for urgent medical cases—while also launching a major SOS Lebanon emergency intervention in autumn to respond quickly where the need was most acute. This approach allowed us to stay flexible, act fast, and deliver direct, life-sustaining aid to the most vulnerable households.



GAZA

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere maintained a major, life-saving humanitarian presence in Gaza under extreme and constantly changing conditions. With a total deployment of €259,583.94—our largest country allocation of the year—we prioritized what could not wait: emergency medical support for civilians (especially children and severely wounded patients), along with essential relief such as food parcels, safe water, and emergency kits for displaced families. Where possible, we also supported repairs and community-based recovery efforts to help families regain a minimum level of stability.

This work was carried out with a strong focus on responsible delivery, documentation, and practical impact—supporting urgent care today while protecting dignity and resilience for tomorrow.



SYRIA



In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere worked in Syria through our trusted partner Beyaz Eller (White Hands) to meet one urgent priority: food security for vulnerable families. With a total allocation of €13,542.00, we focused our support around two key moments of the year—Ramadan and Eid al-Adha—when families facing crisis are often under even greater pressure.

During Ramadan, we delivered both food parcels and hot meals, ensuring households had essentials to get through the month with dignity. During Eid al-Adha, we supported Qurbani distributions so families could receive meat—often one of the few times in the year they can access it. All expenditures were verified through partner reporting and supporting documentation, confirming that funds were used directly for emergency relief on the ground.






WHERE WE WORK IN AFRICA



Madagascar

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere supported a vulnerable community in Tulear, Madagascar through small but meaningful actions delivered with a trusted local partner. With a total expenditure of €740, we focused on food security during Ramadan, Qurbani sheep distribution, and basic mosque maintenance—including painting and a new carpet—so the community could benefit from both nourishment and a dignified shared space. From iftar meals serving families during Ramadan to practical support around the mosque renovation and community gatherings, these targeted interventions helped strengthen solidarity and provided direct relief where even modest support can make a real difference.



Somalia

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere responded to urgent needs in Somalia through trusted local partners in Mogadishu, with a total deployment of €17,019.36. Our focus was clear: reduce food insecurity and provide emergency support to families living on the edge. The largest part of our work took place during Ramadan, when we distributed food parcels and meals to the most vulnerable—widows, elderly people, children, and households with no stable income. During Eid al-Adha, we funded Qurban meat distribution so families could receive essential nutrition that many only access once a year.

We also kept a dedicated emergency support line for sudden crises—illness, loss of income, or other urgent shocks—so families could regain short-term stability. All expenditures were delivered through verified partners and recorded with full supporting documentation for audit and annual reporting.



MALI

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere focused its work in Mali on one life-changing priority: safe drinking water. With a total investment of €22,320.04, we funded the construction and renovation of water wells and village drinking points in rural areas where families previously depended on distant, unsafe sources.

These projects were designed to be sustainable—covering drilling, pump installations, protective measures to reduce contamination, and reliable access points for daily use. Alongside the infrastructure, we also supported communities during implementation through locally necessary logistics and basic assistance tied directly to the well sites. The result is long-term impact: safer water, better hygiene, and fewer waterborne illnesses—while also reducing the daily burden on women and children who used to spend hours fetching water.



Tanzania–Malawi–Zanzibar

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere supported vulnerable communities across Tanzania, Malawi, and Zanzibar through a balanced approach that combined long-term infrastructure with immediate life-saving relief. With a total deployment of €27,904.75, we invested in projects that leave lasting impact—especially education facilities and water wells—while also responding to daily survival needs through food programmes, Qurbani distributions, and targeted social assistance for families facing sudden medical or financial crises.

Across the region, our priority remained the same: reaching those who carry the heaviest burden—orphans, widows, elderly people, and households living in extreme vulnerability—with support that is both practical today and strengthening for tomorrow.



UGANDA

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere delivered focused, high-urgency support in Uganda with a total expenditure of €4,510.00, implemented through our local partner to ensure aid reached the people who needed it most. The programme combined food security and basic medical relief: the largest share of funding supported Qurbani distributions (13 cows) during Eid al-Adha, providing vulnerable families with nutritious meat—often a rare source of protein.

Alongside this, we funded iftar meals during Ramadan and covered essential medical treatments for individuals who would otherwise have struggled to access care. All activities were recorded through official transactions and aligned with annual accounts for transparent reporting



SOMALIA

In 2024, Gardens of the Sincere made a major regional commitment across Cameroon, Togo, Niger, and Benin, with a total deployment of €131,631.00. Our approach combined immediate relief with long-term support: the largest effort was a wide-reaching Qurbani operation, distributing meat from 370 cows to families who rarely have access to animal protein—especially widows, orphans, elderly people, and households in extreme hardship.

Alongside this, we supported food programmes outside Eid to stabilize families facing chronic poverty, funded medical assistance for common but dangerous illnesses (including malaria), and invested in water wells and community infrastructure to improve daily living conditions and reduce preventable disease. The result was a balanced response: urgent help when people needed it most, and practical investments that strengthen resilience beyond one season.

Key Financial Highlights

- **Water & Sanitation:** This was a high-impact priority in India, where 97.7% (€8,500) of the budget went to 23 wells, and in Nepal, where 48.09% was spent on core infrastructure. Sri Lanka also focused half its budget (€6,858.72) on water projects.
- **Food Security (Qurbani & Ramadan):** Major investments were made in West Africa, where Qurbani cattle accounted for 60–65% of the €131,631 budget. In Syria, Ramadan projects made up 88.34% of total spending, and in Uganda, Qurbani accounted for 86.47%.
- **Emergency Relief:** Apart from the major deployment in Gaza, significant emergency funds were used for flood relief in Pakistan (€5,509) and the SOS Lebanon intervention (€5,000).
- **Livelihood & Development:** In Indonesia, the organization invested 60.66% (€5,009.35) of its local budget into a Palm Oil Project for sustainable economic development.
- **Implementation & Transparency:** Several regions included dedicated funds for Project Support & Implementation to ensure transparent delivery, most notably in Pakistan (51.31% of the total) and Yemen (15.44% of the total)
